

TWELFTH ANNUAL KIDS FEST - SATURDAY, JUNE 22!

The Hanover Township Board of Trustees, working in cooperation with the Hanover Township Park Committee, is hosting the Twelfth Annual Kids

Fest on Saturday, June 22 at the Hanover

Township Memorial Park.

At 1:00PM the event will open with a Treasure Hunt for children ages 1 through 12 with special prizes to be awarded.

Beginning at 1:00PM as well, kids can enjoy face painting, clowns, special demonstrations, and equipment displays by Law Enforcement, Fire/EMS, Public Works Operations, Butler County Metro Parks and other non-profit groups.

Patriotic-theme poster contest will once again be reviewed by veterans! Kids- bring a poster you made that shows what patriotism means to you. Judging will occur at approximately 2:00PM.

At 3:00PM, a fitness for fun activity is scheduled as kids ages 4 through 12 (and older "kids" ages 13 and up) compete in races held on the .55 mile walking path. Race prizes will be awarded by categories. From 1:00PM to 4:00PM, special activities including a pieeating contest, a K-9 information booth, and various games will be featured.

Hay wagon rides (depending on weather) for parents and children will run in the Park area.

GENERAL OPERATING UPDATES/TOWNSHIP COMMITMENTS

As the result of the generosity of Hanover Township voters, the Board of Trustees has been following through on commitments made to Law Enforcement, Road Maintenance, Fire Department and Park Operations. As was published earlier, the Township was able to enter into a renewal contract with the Butler County

Sheriff's Office to provide two deputies to patrol Hanover Township only and not cut back any services. Officers cover first and second shifts staggered and overlapping to have coverage all seven days during the week.

For the Fire Department, a new combined pumper and tanker unit was purchased and is operational. The combined unit saved the Township over \$200,000.00. A Fire/EMS Command vehicle has been purchased as well as one Lucas- Chest Compression System used for CPR EMS operations. A grant is pending to purchase a second Lucas System.

The Board of Trustees also ordered a new dump truck/snow plow which arrived in late April and is operational. A new roadside enclosed tractor mower has been ordered with updated safety features which will replace old outdated equipment. The Board continues to analyze road maintenance needs to improve safety and efficiency in road operations.

REMINDER: OPEN BURNING RESTRICTIONS

Each year the Township receives inquiries about open burning laws and restrictions. The Board of Trustees believes it is important to alert residents

each year of the restrictions set forth by the State of Ohio and the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency. Open burning is prohibited in Hanover Township and surrounding jurisdictions except for limited circumstances. Open burning is defined as any outdoor fire. Open burning worsens the air quality in southwestern Ohio and can have armful effects on people's health. Additionally, di

air quality in southwestern Ohio and can have harmful effects on people's health. Additionally, dry fields and farms are very susceptible to fires during the hot and dry periods throughout the year. The Ohio Administrative Code allows for open burning for cooking for human consumption, heating tar, welding torches, smudge pots, ceremonial exercises, grilling, and heating for warmth of outdoor workers. Open burning may also occur under certain circumstances by permit which can be determined by calling the Southwest Ohio Air Quality Agency at 513-946-1711. Open burning complaints are also handled by this agency.

BRIEFS ON INFORMATION AND PEOPLE

Did you Know: The Board of Trustees is responsible for geographic territory covering 36 square miles and for 35.9 Township road miles.

Public Safety: Hanover Township Fire and EMS units responded to 777 runs and details in 2018. Fire Inspectors completed 20 Fire Code inspections in the Township. The Butler County Sheriff's Office Deputies (2) under contract with the Township responded to 2111 dispatched details, made 44 arrests and provided 57,600 minutes of Community Oriented Policing patrolling neighborhood streets.

Recycling for Hanover Township:

Only one recycling location remains in Hanover Township at 1880 Morman Road, northern Park Parking Lot. Please follow recycling instructions. No general waste or building materials are allowed. The Township has added one more bin.

You can recycle the following items at a drop box or at the curb: Newspapers, magazines, junk mail, phone books, brown paper bags, office paper, cardboard, paperboard (such as cereal boxes), plastic bottles & jugs, glass bottles & food jars, aluminum cans, steel cans and empty aerosol cans (remove tip).

Residents should contact an area waste hauler to set up household trash collection and curbside recycling. Haulers in the area include Rumpke, CSI Waste and other local waste haulers.

2019 ROAD PROGRAM FOR HANOVER TOWNSHIP

The 2019 Road Improvement Program set forth by the Board of Trustees involves several streets and different applications. This work is bid through the Butler County Engineer's Office to save money and work will occur during the 2019 construction season. Re-base and patching work is scheduled for Darrtown Road dead end 150 feet, Decamp Road two spots 70 and 100 feet respectively, Cochran Road 100 feet and repair of cross cracks on Jesse Drive. Chip and Seal work scheduled for Hussey Road Dead end to US 27 and Brunner

Road Dead end to
Stahlheber Road
has been postponed
to 2020 due to bid
and construction
complications. Road
Re-Trace work is
scheduled Hogue,
Krucker, and Darrtown
Roads. Other work under

consideration is the replacement

of the Gene Avenue culvert/bridge. (Grant funds are being sought for this project.) A major sink

hole impacting the Gene Avenue Culvert and Amarillo Drive has been repaired and finished in May with use of Community Development Block Grant Funds.

The Hanover Township Road Department will provide other smaller maintenance projects throughout the year.
