The Hanover Ladies Industrial Band met at the Hanover Township Community Center for its annual banquet on May 10, 2012, and *celebrated 112 years of service* in the community. The first meeting of The Hanover Ladies Industrial Band was organized in February 1900 at the home of Mrs. Frank Krucker. The group originally had 17 members. To attend this meeting, the ladies arrived in horse-drawn buggies and wagons. In the early days the Band supported the Valley View Sunday School, affiliated with the First Baptist Church of Hamilton.

Today the group has 11 members. The purpose of the Hanover Ladies Industrial Band is to consider one another and to provide love, good works, and a closer fellowship with each other. It also strives to provide community service and provide aid to people in the Hanover Township area and to demonstrate faith in God by scripture, readings, and prayers. The Band has been supportive of the Hanover Township Community Center by providing small appliances and supplies to support the use of the building as a community service. Earlier this year the Board of Trustees recognized their efforts in supporting the community.
